You Help Dad Manage Son's Health Condition

ver since Brian learned his son has autism, he's worked hard to provide the healthiest food possible to best manage 5-year-old Logan's symptoms.

Brian explains there are certain foods that are especially beneficial for a child with autism, like fresh fruits and vegetables. But the food Logan most needs is also typically the most expensive at the grocery store.

It helps, and you know food is coming.

Brian receives some SNAP benefits and disability assistance. But he says after paying bills he often struggles to afford the nutritious groceries and supplements Logan needs — especially toward the end of the month.

Last year at Logan's school, Brian heard about Second Harvest's Mobile Pantry at 5 Loaves 4 Kids in Tullahoma. Ever since, he's been coming to pick up healthy groceries for himself and his son.

"It helps, and you know food is coming," Brian says of the Mobile Pantry you make possible.

On the day we met them, Logan was listening to music and dancing around the food at the Mobile Pantry. He told us his favorite foods are grapes, apples, and strawberries.

"Thank you," Brian says to donors like you. "[You] definitely give a lot."

Medical Experience **Fuels** Volunteer **Service**

ith more than 30 years of medical experience, Dr. Linda McCafferty has seen hunger up close.

She's seen patients who must choose between filling their prescription and filling their pantry, whose poor nutrition only feeds their chronic illnesses, and who have suffered adverse emotional and mental effects from being food insecure.

These first-hand experiences fuel her dedication to our mission.

"Hunger is a big passion of mine." Linda said. "I think we have a responsibility for those of us who have been blessed to take that on and do something about it."

After giving monetarily for several years, Linda started donating her time as well in early 2018. Her first shifts were in Second Harvest's warehouse where she sorted food and enjoyed the fastpaced environment.

But she was quickly drawn to our Mobile Pantries, one-day distributions that bring about 20,000 pounds

of food directly to hungry families and individuals in their neighborhoods.

A friend introduced her to Chris Whitney, founder of One Generation Away, a Second Harvest Partner Agency and indispensable Mobile Pantry partner. Since that introduction, Linda has volunteered her time at several Mobile Pantry distributions.

At a typical Mobile Pantry, she'll bag food, escort families through the distribution line, and push grocery carts full of food to clients' cars.

But her favorite responsibility is giving kindness, dignity, and the occasional hug to those in need. "When you go do a Mobile Pantry, you're getting more out of it than you're giving," Linda said.

If Linda's firsthand experiences fuel her passion to fight hunger, it's her innate desire to give back that sparked that passion. When asked why she keeps coming in to our warehouse and out to our Mobile Pantries, she said, "It is a need to serve."

Whether it's helping her patients or providing for our hungry neighbors, Linda has turned her need to serve into her vocation, because in her words. "that's the stuff that feeds your soul."

ill was diagnosed with a rare medical condition 12 years ago called Budd-Chiari syndrome. She survived a liver transplant at age 29, but afterward

she was unable to continue her work in an assisted living facility. Since then, she's struggled to support herself and her son on her disability check alone.

Her son is an energetic 9-year-old who loves to play soccer. Jill is focused on providing him the most nutritious food she can.

"This food helps out a lot," she says.

ith four kids at home and only one income, it's hard for Eva to keep her kitchen stocked with healthy groceries for her family. Her husband works outside the home while she cares for their children, ages 10, 6, 2, and 15 months.

Eva recently earned her GED certification so she can find a job to help supplement her husband's income. But their youngest child is having surgery soon and will require Eva's aroundthe-clock care.

Eva's husband works in construction, but his income isn't stable from week to week. Work slows during the rainy season, leaving the family without a paycheck sometimes.

The older children receive free lunches at school, though Eva says it's especially challenging to make up for meals when the kids are at home. She says it's difficult to watch her kids open the refrigerator

and ask for food — food that often isn't there.

Thankfully, Eva connected with the food pantry at First Baptist Shelbyville, a partner agency of Second Harvest. Your gifts help make sure this food pantry is stocked with healthy groceries, including fresh fruits and vegetables.

Now, her children can be better prepared for success in the classroom as a new school year gets underway.
