

he high cost of food and other goods is impacting all of us. For families like Jerry's, it has become a challenge each day just to put food on the table.

"We moved to Nashville to try to make a better life for my little kid," Jerry says. "But the prices of everything have gone up and up. It's hard to get by."

Jerry works full time at a nearby warehouse, and throughout the pandemic, he reported to work every day to support his wife and their 9-year-old son.

"They gave us the chance to stay working during the pandemic, so I kept working to support my

family," he says. "No matter



hristina's family is like many families across Middle Tennessee. When every day is a struggle to put food on the table, planning a special holiday meal is hard to imagine.

"The holidays are coming up and we're wondering if we're going to have enough to feed the family," Christina says.

Her family of four lives in Chester County where her husband repairs semi-trailers for a living and she stays at home to care for their children. She would love to have a job, too, but childcare is just too expensive.

The one-income household earns just enough to not qualify for SNAP benefits but still struggles to make ends meet most months.

"It's very hard being a family these days, even when you are working," Christina says. "Paying bills, it's very hard these are trying times."

Free school meals are a big help for Christina's kids, Caden, 11, and Alayna, 5. But when there is no school, Christina worries about feeding her little ones.

Thankfully, Christina found help through one of our Partner Agencies, the Henderson Community Soup Kitchen. Here she has access to the healthy foods her growing children need — fresh fruit, vegetables, lean meats, and more.

These are especially difficult days for Dale, who lost his job during the pandemic and is still struggling to recover.

"I used to work at a pallet mill and then I went to work at a cabinet shop after that," Dale says.

To get by, Dale cut back completely on buying things for himself, including clothing and other personal items, instead focusing all of his funds on his children, the youngest of whom is just 7.

When he needs extra help to put healthy food on the table, Dale visits Five Loaves Mobile Food Pantry in Crawford which serves hundreds of families. It's a huge relief to know his children can receive the food they need during this challenging time.

"It helps quite a bit," he says. "Especially when you are low on money and can't afford much."
